UEA has made the December 2015 version of *Revuo Esperanto* freely downloadable, even for non-members. You can access it at espinfo.org/revuo-dec-2015.

You'll notice elsewhere in this issue of Update that members of UEA receive a copy of *Revuo* 11 times a year as part of their subscription, available in both digital and paper

formats. The cheapest option (which is the one which I use) costs only £8, for those of you who are happy to read the electronic version.

DUOLINGO UPDATE

I expect that most of you will now be familiar with the name Duolingo, even if you can't visualise it. The online learning platform introduced its Esperanto version for English-speakers in May, 2015. At the point I'm writing this in the first week of December, 200,000 people have started the course.

The success of the version for English-speakers has led to a very positive spin-off: "Esperanto for Spanish-speakers" is now under development. It's only possible under Duolingo's rules to develop a course in language X for one language at a time, so Spanish is an excellent second choice; it has more native speakers than English and fewer only than Mandarin Chinese and Hindi.

And this causes my mind to wander and wonder: Will we one day see a Duolingo course "X for Esperanto-speakers"? Wouldn't that be a result?

BRITISH CONFERENCE 2016: LIVERPOOL

The conference in Liverpool promises to deliver a fun, varied programme, hot on the heels of the Buchanan Masterclass. But the programme isn't all.

I can confirm from recently acquired personal experience that there's much to see in Liverpool itself. My nephew stopped over on a recent weekend and so I put him to work, issuing him with a mini Esperanto flag. Alfie, Clare and I trekked all around Liverpool taking in the monuments, buildings and docks. As you can see below, he's a lot more photogenic than his uncle.

The guest presenter at the event is Kalle Kniivilä from Sweden, a journalist and award-winning author who will be presenting two sessions, both of which revolve around his books, the acclaimed *Homoj de Putin* and his new one, *Nepoj de*

Sovetoj.

We've had a new addition to the programme in recent days. Guilherme Fians, a postgraduate student, will be talking about his homeland, Brazil. He'll be joining Hilary Chapman, whose speciality subject will be on the Liverpudlian Edith Alleyne Sinnott, who holds the distinction of being Esperanto's first female novelist.



With the printed version of this issue of Update also comes a nomination form for people willing to volunteer as trustees for the charity.

Trusteeship is a serious and necessary role, without which a charity cannot remain operational. It's important that we introduce new trustees periodically rather than rely indefinitely on those currently in place. It's particularly urgent that we find somebody willing and able to sit as treasurer.

Trustees communicate primarily by email and meet up to five times per year. They may choose to get involved in special projects or areas of interest, working on their own, in subgroups with other trustees or with other volunteers. Several of the trustees carry titles indicating specific responsibilities, such as secretary or treasurer, but all are equally responsible in law for the good governance of the charity.

And once the event comes to a close, people wanting to stay on will be able to enjoy a group meal at Zizzi's restaurant, just as we did in Sheffield and Brighton previously. You have to book this in advance, though, so make sure to do so instead of just turning up on the day. I'll be adding more details to the conference site nearer the time.

NOTES FROM THE OCTOBER TRUSTEES' MEETING

Several months since their working weekend, the trustees convened at Esperanto House in October. For the last several years this meeting has taken place over Skype and was set to again this year.

However, following two separate suggestions at the AGM that EAB consider creating a paid position for somebody to take over much of my workload, we decided that it would be better for as many of us as possible to meet in person in order to better go over the details.

And so it was that Paul Gubbins, Clare Hunter, Ian Carter, Paul Dennett and I sat around the table in the office. For Edmund Grimley Evans and Ed Robertson reaching Esperanto House in the first place would've taken longer than the meeting itself, so they joined us by Skype.

LIBRARY & EDUCATION

The most positive report in the session came from Paul Dennett, who has taken over responsibility for the Butler Library with aplomb since his appointment at the AGM. He indicated that his optimising shelf space had proceeded so well that he is en route to being able to make plans for the future to help organise a catalogue.

Ed Robertson had had a very busy year because he's one of the contributors

to Duolingo, and refining the course and dealing with reports is eating up a lot of his time. He was very pleased that at this point there were 160,000 registered users.

I was happy to report that I had taken receipt of some proprietary software designed by Judith Meyer, which allows for course content to dynamically adjust to users' mistakes. I reported that Judith has offered to fly to the UK at her own expense to tutor us in how to prepare lessons using it, prior to my starting work in greater detail, likely in the second half of 2016, once the conference and website revamp are out the way.

MEMBERSHIP & RESEARCH

Viv O'Dunne reported on membership numbers. Although we had 30 new arrivals, the net result was a fall of 14. That doesn't sound very many out of context, but with such a relatively small membership base in the first place, it represents a fall of 5%.

Paul Gubbins reported that Angela Tellier was working assiduously to ensure the smooth running of the Buchanan Masterclass in partnership with the University of Liverpool. The three-day event will immediately precede the 2016

conference. We had heard from Angela that her research into the first Buchanan lecturer, Professor W. E. Collinson, was going very well, such that she may well be in a position to publish a book on him in 2016. We were also very pleased to hear that a new project to compile a book based on people's memories about Esperanto over the course of their lives is well underway.

Clare Hunter and I left the room at the point when recruitment was brought up. Since I'm already doing the work that a replacement would cover and might have the option of reducing hours at my real job, I might understandably be interested in such a position. We therefore vacated the premises so as not to influence discussion and allow people the freedom to argue the pluses and minuses.

As it happens, the remaining trustees decided that they would need more time to speak about a prospective role and so they arranged to meet again at a later date specifically to discuss this, a meeting from which Clare and I would be absent—the first trustee meeting we'll ever have missed. Considering we once cut short a holiday in order to be able to participate in a meeting, we'll be sad to lose the 100% record but it's for the right reasons.

BUCHANAN MASTERCLASS

2016's John Buchanan Masterclass in Esperanto offers an eclectic mix of discussion topics on the theme of Esperanto culture for advanced speakers of Esperanto, sessions on Esperanto literature and ticklish aspects of Esperanto grammar, and the opportunity for beginners and post-beginners to learn and improve their knowledge of the language.

The programme consists of three main study strands, although participants may mix and match according to preference. Refreshments and lunch are provided. Details of topics and presenters may be found on the Masterclass website, espinfo.org/masterclass-liverpool.

We are delighted to welcome Professors Duncan Charters and Renato Corsetti, who will be guiding a presentation and discussion of aspects of Esperanto culture for advanced speakers of Esperanto, and Anna Lowenstein, author of *La Štona urbo* and member of the Esperanto Academy, who will deliver language-learning sessions for beginners and post-beginners.

Dr Paul Gubbins will use extracts from his bilingual anthology *Star in a Night Sky* to present a study of key texts from original Esperanto literature, whilst Professor Wim Jansen complements this with sessions examining some typical aspects of Esperanto grammar, illustrated with examples from literature.

Finally, Duncan Charters will deliver two early-evening lectures ("Issues in translation: Cervantes and Lorca in English and Esperanto" and "How Catalan Esperantists kept Catalan literature alive outside Spain in the post Civil War period").

For ideas on accommodation, information on attendance grants for young people under 25, and a provisional timetable, please see espinfo.org/masterclass-liverpool. As the Masterclass finishes the 2016 British Esperanto Conference starts, so why not make it a five-day period of immersion in the language?

The John Buchanan Masterclass in Esperanto runs from the 16th to the 18th of March, 2016 at the Foresight Centre, University of Liverpool.


